



## **KEEPING IN TOUCH DURING LOCKDOWN**

As we move to remote learning during this period of lockdown, we feel that some regular contact with the children from their class teacher is vitally important. In order for this, we are ensuring that all parents have access to ClassDojo. Class teachers will also be holding regular Zoom sessions too.



### **Using Zoom**

At the same times each day, the children will be invited to join a zoom meeting either in the morning or afternoon.

This invitation can be accessed via ClassDojo.

The meeting will be an opportunity to see the rest of the children in their class and chat to their teacher. They will also be able to discuss any work that they have completed during the day or any problems that they may have had.

### **ClassDojo**

We all are used to using Class Dojo by now and so teachers will also be monitoring the site every weekday, posting messaging and responding to any questions you or your child might have. We will also be using the Portfolio within Dojo to allow you to upload any photos of learning and even worksheets and/or completed pieces of learning. If you have not already accessed portfolio this year, your child's class teacher can send you access via Dojo messaging. This is a really useful element of ClassDojo that we would encourage all families to have a go with. If you are not connected to ClassDojo, it is vital that you get in touch with school to rectify this.
